Wrestlers End Hill's Reign With 5 Champs

Hill Edges Hershey In Runner-Up Battle; Gladish Voted Best

Academy of the New Church, Bryn Athyn, placed five individual champions in the 10 weight classes Saturday night to romp off with top honors in the 25th annual Lehigh U. prep School Wrestling Tournament before 3,000 fans in Grace Hall.

The victory snapped a four-year domination by The Hill School of Allentown, which fought off a strong challenge by Milton Hershey to finish second, 71 points to 70. Bryn Athyn totaled 89.

John Gladish, Bryn Athyn 168-pounder, was named "Most Outstanding Wrestler" of the two-day tournament. Other Bryn Athyn

Pottstown Prep Schoolers Get 103 Points To Outdistance Field; Roger Oleson Tops

Hill School, accustomed to winning the annual Prep School Wrestling Championships at Lehigh University, kept faith with its supporters Saturday night and captured its 12th team title in 14 appearances here.

The Pottstown preppers took five of the 11 individual titles and totaled a record 103 points. The champs also picked up one second and a pair of third places in final bouts which preceded the Lehigh-Colgate dual meet.

Hill's Roger Oleson was named "most outstanding wrestler" and received a trophy from George Halfacre, tourney director.

Milton Hershey School, with 63 points, was a distant second. Academy of the New Church (Bryn Athyn) and Kiski Prep shared third spot with 58 apiece. Bryn Athyn won last year.
