St. Benedict's Prep of Newark scored 59 points and two individual championships to win the 32nd annual Prep Schools and Academies Wrestling Tournament and the first James B. Detrixhe Memorial Trophy on Saturday night at Lehigh University's Grace Hall.

In second place for the second year was Baylor School with 38 points. Last year, Baylor finished one point behind Milton Hershey.

Following the top teams were McCallie School, 53 points and Milton Hershey with 51 points as 42 teams sent 238 wrestlers into action.

Titleists Dennis Gibson (148) and Bill Robrecht (168) and two runnersup paced St. Benedict's to the title.

Dave Icenhower of Penn Charter defended his title successfully to win the outstanding wrestler of the tournament honors. Jim Glasser of McCallie retained his 157-pound title with an overtime win while another defending champ, Jim Krapf of Tathall, won the 183-pound crown.

Hill School Captures Crown In Prep Wrestling Tourney

Hill School of Pottstown and McCallie of Chattanooga, Tenn., finished one-two in the two-day 33rd annual National Independent College Preparatory Schools and Academies wrestling tournament which ended Saturday night at Lehigh University.

The Hill School team, tourney winners in 1965, failed to get an individual champion but had a trio of men finishing second and three others placing fourth

to win the James B. Detrixhe Memorial Trophy presented by Julius Detrixhe, the late Lehigh wrestling star's father.

Hill finished with 55 points to McCallie's 43. Tatnall School of Wilmington, Del., which came up with the outstanding individual wrestler in heavyweight Jim Krapf, had 36 points and defending champion St. Benedict's of Newark was fourth with 32 points.

Krapf pinned all four of his opponents enroute to his most outstanding wrestler honors.

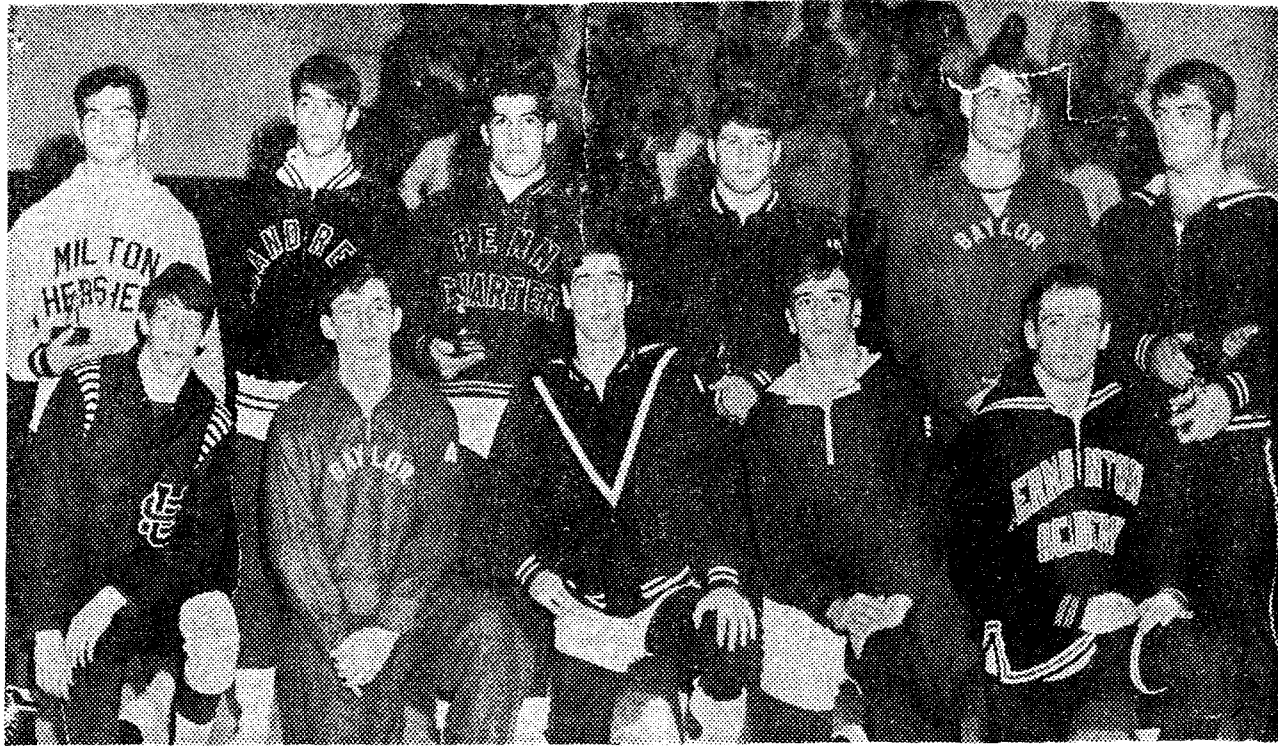

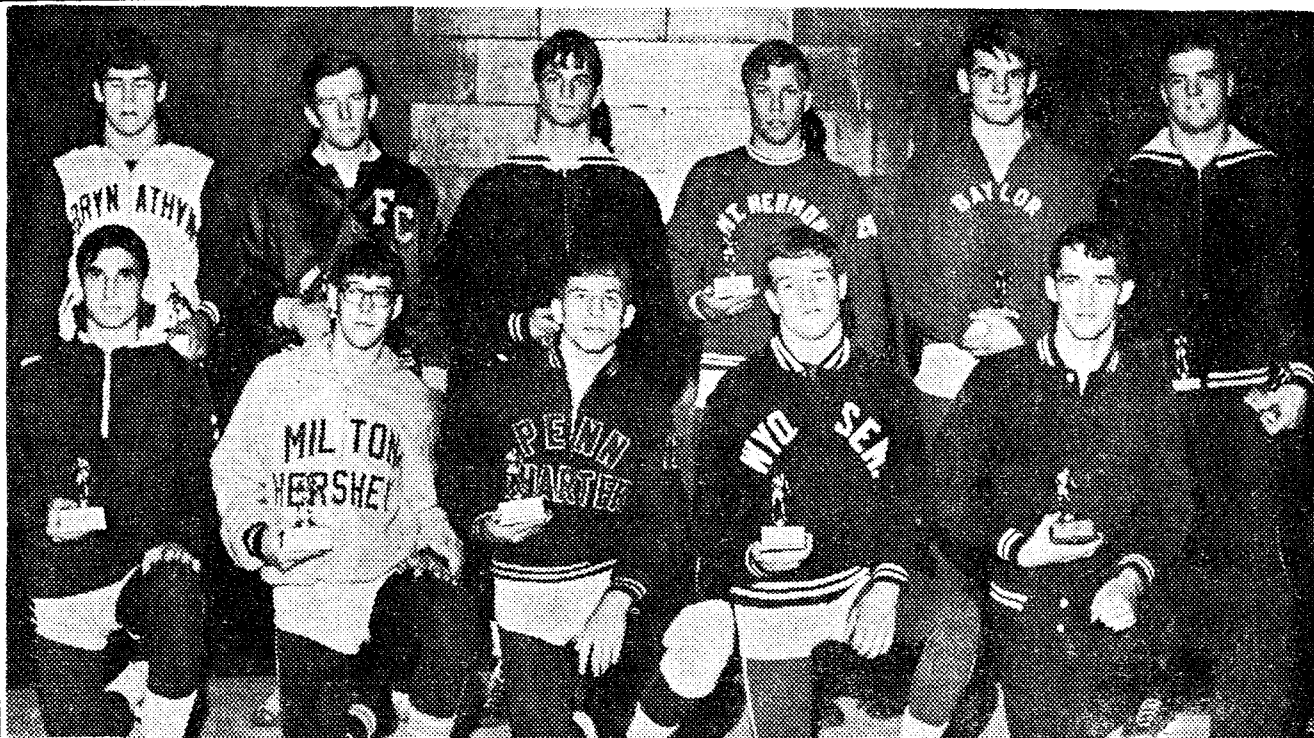
